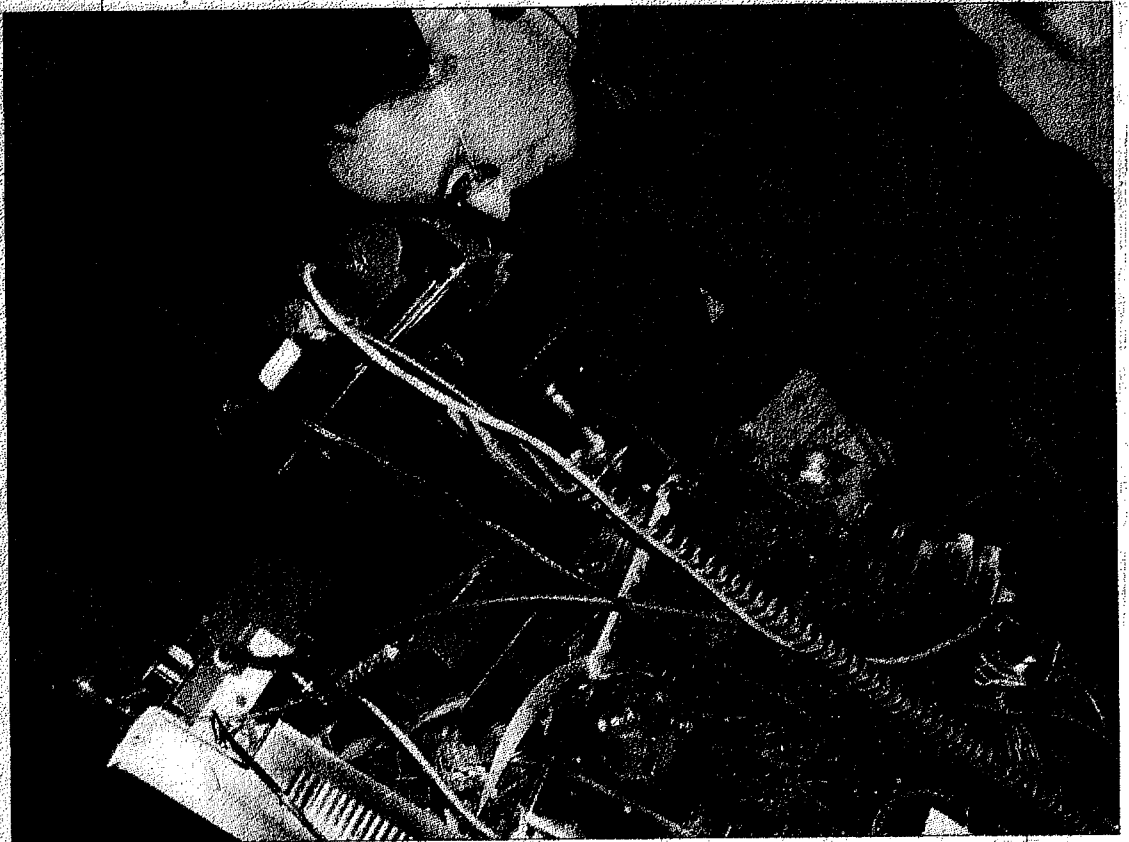

Gizmologist does electronic sculpture music

Steve Storz (known by some as The Gizmologist) returns to Sheva Café Friday (Nov. 5) as part of an ongoing performance series the first three Fridays of each month. The artist, known for his Grunge Machines and other electronic sculpture, will perform live ambient electronic music at Sheva Café from 7-9 p.m.

Storz recently added an electronic Theremin to his sound sculpture cobbled together from answering machine circuits, an old sampling keyboard, motors with microphones on them, various reverb and distortion boxes and his own vocals. The Theremin is a device that makes eerie sounding music used in the film "Forbidden Planet," not to mention the "Spider-Man 2" video game in the Mysterio segment. Storz uses samples of various sounds, some from his own vocal chords, to create cool atmospheric sound spaces. Even cooler, it's free.
